And, if there was anyone in the room with a camera, you can best bet he would be the first one in front of it, styling in one of his many trademark poses—a lot of them shirtless—showing off his numerous tattoos. He knew how to have a good time and did nothing halfway. To Victor, the world was his stage, and he enjoyed every minute of being in the spotlight.

But as much as Victor loved to have fun, he also understood the importance of family, hard work, reaching personal goals, finding your passion and living your dream. Possessing a natural gift of rhyme and storytelling and an unwavering belief in himself and his abilities, backed by a strong business sense and an understanding of the importance of controlling and owning your art and product, he produced and recorded on the local, independent label, ROYALTY MUZIK, where he also served as co-founder and immediately got down to work recording several quality tracks and videos with Prosound Studios in Harrisburg, as artist “Lil’ Rad.” These works gained him much popularity and respect among young people in the city, and he handled it all with humility and graciousness. Even with the flurry of activity in his life, Victor always put family first and made time for his friends. He was a devoted father of two young sons, who were also his constant traveling companions, three god-children; a loving partner to his fiancée and mother of his sons; a good son to his parents; a strong and protective brother who loved to pick on and wrestle with his youngest brother in the middle of the night; an adoring grandson; nephew, uncle and a true and faithful friend.

Our hearts were shattered in the wee hours of Sunday, December 4, 2011, when Victor made his sudden transition into eternal life. But, he leaves a legacy of love that will remain ever-present in the hearts and minds of the many souls he touched in his lifetime.
