Naomi G. Davis, daughter of Lorryne Gibson Grimes and the late Edgar Gibson, was born Wednesday, July 10, 1940, in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania.

Affectionately known as “Omie” by family and friends, Naomi was educated in the Harrisburg School District where she graduated from William Penn High School, Class of 1958. Very active during her school years, Omie participated in Intramurals I, II and III, tennis, ping pong, badminton, softball, basketball and was affiliated with BTP-Beta Ty Rho Sorority and the Red Cross as a Junior Volunteer.

In pursuit of further learning and career preparation, Omie attended Thompson Business College. Her career path included retirement from the New Cumberland Army Depot in 2005 after thirty years of service; part-time employment with Community Medical Associates from 2005 to 2009 and, lastly, due to declining health, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Department of Revenue from 2004 to 2014.

Omie could best be described as friendly, kind, loving, dedicated, hardworking, nurturing, jovial, sophisticated; and, not to mention, a lady who truly loved to shop and ‘eat.’

Between the ages of thirteen to fifteen, Omie accepted Jesus Christ as her personal Savior at Prospect Primitive Baptist Church founded by her grandfather, the late Reverend H. E. Corbin Sr., later named United Primitive Baptist Church and currently known as United Baptist Church. As a member of United Baptist Church, under the pastorate of the Reverend Leonard C. Rier Jr., Omie dedicated herself to Altar Discipleship, Senior Choir, Usher Board, The Unitones, Cook/Dining Area Set-up Coordinator and as Head Trustee. While at the PinnacleHealth Community General Osteopathic Hospital on Monday, August 18, 2014, at seventy-four years of age, God, In His Infinite Wisdom and Divine Love, called Trustee Naomi G. Davis into eternal life joining her father, Edgar Gibson; sister,

Beverly DeVan; brother, Edgar "Pete" Gibson, and other loved ones.
