



## Benjamin Franklin Scott Sr.

November 19, 1923 - February 19, 2025

Benjamin F. Scott was born on November 19, 1923, in Sylvania, GA. He was the second of 7 children born to the late Dewitt (Alex) Scott and Henrietta (Kent) Scott.

Frank, as he was called, received his elementary and high school education in the public schools of Screven County, Sylvania, Georgia. Many of his fellow students said that he was very knowledgeable, and they referred to him as the “little professor.” His mother referred to Frank as being kindhearted and generous – as a child, always sharing with his younger siblings.

Before leaving Georgia, Frank did share cropping and worked at the Savannah Paper Mill with his brother Bill. After leaving Georgia, he came to Steelton, PA and resided with his uncle John Calvin Scott, his father’s brother. He married Virginia Fox and until the time of her passing, they were married for 73 years. From their union, there are eight children.

Frank worked at the Penn Harris hotel for over 15 years as a boiler man. He retired from Dauphin County after working at Dauphin Manor for over 15 years. He also worked part time as a banquet waiter at the Penn Harris Hotel where he met and served many high-profile individuals.

He encouraged his children to complete their high school education. He and

Virginia taught their children life skills, etiquette, and how to respect others. He was welcoming and caring to all family members and friends.

Benjamin Scott went to sleep on February 19, 2025, to rest until the Lord returns. He is preceded in death by his father, mother, and siblings, Willie Arthur Scott, Sr., Annie Bell Scott Gordon, Dewey Dewitt Scott, Calvin Richard Scott, and Jessie Edell Scott-Thompson.

He is survived by six sons, Benjamin Jr., Eddie (Katherine), Herbert (Mitlean), Purcel (Betty), Joseph (Beatrice), Richard (Penney); three daughters, Henrietta Wendy Scott, Veronica Scott, Marcia Scott-Williams (Nate); and a host of grand, great grands, great-great grandchildren, nieces, nephews, and cousins.
