Carrie graduated from old Steelton High School, Steelton, PA, and retired from the Harrisburg State Hospital, Dietary Services, after twenty-three years of tireless service. Carrie was a faithful worker. A story is told of her employer having her picked up on a snowmobile because she wanted to get to work!

She loved bingo, cooking, shopping and caring for her plants. She loved to read and was a fashion icon, always matched with shoes and a hat. Oh, and of course, all the gold and diamonds that any miner would want on her ears, neck and fingers! She dedicated her life to her children and grandchildren. Her home was and still remains the “uptown meeting place” for all their friends and her extended large family.

Carrie was a soft-spoken woman, slow to speak, but when she did, it was like E. F. Hutton, everyone listened. She spoke her mind without apology, would give you a look expressing no nonsense accepted, and could delight her family and friends with her sense of humor—all in a few quick moments. She

held many titles of affection, such as “Jazzy Carrie,” “C.I.W” and “Sugar-Plum,” but her most cherished title was “MOM.”

She was a member of Beulah Baptist Church, Steelton, and served faithfully on the Usher Board until her declining health.

Throughout her life, Carrie being the third youngest of four girls, had a very special relationship with her baby sister and best friend, Liza Warren Howard, who affectionately called her “Twilla.” They were inseparable peas in a pod, finding their way together through this earthly journey. It was seldom you saw one, without seeing the other. It is befitting they would somehow, someway talk God into letting them into Heaven together.

While at the Holy Spirit Hospital, Camp Hill, PA, on Friday, January 25, 2013, Carrie peacefully transitioned into eternal rest.
