Elizabeth Jackson Ferrell was born November 9, 1929, in Wellborn, Florida, to the late Nathaniel and Carrie Bell (Dotie) Jackson.

Elizabeth, "Liz or Miss Liz," as she was affectionately called by family and friends, was a Wife, Mother, Grandmother, Great-Grandmother and Great-Great-Grandmother. She loved her family and friends. She loved cooking big meals with three to four meats, especially on holidays; sitting around talking, laughing and enjoying each other's company. She was a beautician by profession.

Elizabeth fellowshiped over the years with several churches, Bethel African Methodist Episcopal Church, Wellborn, Florida, Bethel A.M.E. Church, Bristol, PA, Mt. Sinai A.M.E.
