After a hard life of sharecropping, at the age of nineteen, Johnny was drafted into the United States Army where he served his country honorably during the Vietnam Conflict in very difficult times. Johnny knew he needed the God his grandmother worshipped. Psalm 46:1, "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble."

Thereafter, Johnny enrolled in truck driving school and traveled across the country doing anything and everything that could be done. After a life of trials, tribulations (both physical and emotional) and health issues, Johnny became "Sick and Tired of Being Tired." At the invitation of a man he knew, Mr. Melvin Watts, Johnny started attending True Worshippers Ministries in April, 2009. He became a saved man under this Ministry.
