Krystin Danielle Holton-Palmer affectionately called Krysie, 37, of Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, departed this life on Tuesday, January 18, 2022 at 1:36 pm at the UPMC Pinnacle Harrisburg Hospital.

Krystin was a member of the Bethuel Temple Church of Christ Apostolic, located in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, pastor Bishop Winston R. Palmer (father). She was saved during an Easter Sunday morning service at the headquarters church in Washington, DC, at the tender age of 7 years old on March 31, 1991, where her grandfather, the Honorable Apostle William R. Palmer Jr. was the founder and pastor. Krystin went to the altar for prayer and the Holy Ghost fell. She began to speak with other tongues as the spirit of God gives utterance. After receiving the precious gift of the Holy Ghost, like the Bible says, she was baptized in the Name of Jesus Christ by her grandfather according to Acts 2:38. She served in various capacities for many years and was an original member of the Pamella T. Palmer (PTP) Echoes of Edification established and directed by Brother Wendel Palmer, Sr.

She was born on December 11, 1984 at Columbia Hospital for Women in Washington D.C. The daughter of Bishop Winston R. Palmer and First Lady Sonya A. Palmer, Krysie briefly attended grade school at ORR Elementary in Washington, D.C. before the family relocated to Harrisburg, Pennsylvania to care for her great grandmother, Mable Rita Johnson.

Krystin completed grade school at Marshall Elementary, and attended William Penn Middle School, graduating from John Harris High School in the Harrisburg, Pennsylvania school system. Krystin also briefly attended Harrisburg Area Community College (HACC).

Krystin was employed with KT& Associates, McDonalds as a manger, Keystone Human Services where she supported adults with special needs and Chewy in Logistics.

Krystin was a loving and compassionate daughter, granddaughter, sister, mother, and friend. She had the most beautiful smile that could light up an entire room. Her life was caring for her children. She loved her children more than she loved herself. She worked unselfishly to ensure that they were properly cared for. Nobody, I mean "Nobody, better bother" her children. Awesome Mommy!!! If you were fortunate enough to be present when she gazed into her children's faces, the pure joy radiating from her would blind you.

Having three sets of twins in eighteen months changed her life forever.

Krystin loved family, painting, music (especially gospel music), football (a Dallas Cowboys fan) and cooking. Krystin was a leader, helper, and a confidante to many. However, "No one is exempt from being checked," was her motto! The relationships she developed were genuine.

She was either with you or not!! Krystin was a wonderful big sister to many. She was a mentor to many of her friends and she always had their backs. When Krystin's friends went through tough times, just knowing that she was there to support them made things brighter.
