Lillie Mae Penn-Hatcher was born on June 21, 1926, in Westfield, North Carolina, to the late Villard and Fannie Mae (Dodd) Penn. She received her formal education in Pinnacle, North Carolina.

Lillie was united in holy matrimony to the late Thomas Paul Hatcher in 1950. Their union was blessed with four beautiful children: Vicki S. Hatcher-Brown, the late Thomas “Gary” Lee Hatcher, C. Anthony Hatcher, and Kenneth P.

She held a deep love for the Lord and her family—both blood and chosen. Lillie exuded a quiet grace and dignity, always prioritizing her family's well-being. She firmly believed in the unity of the family.

Lillie cherished her daily routine, which included her beloved soap operas. Feeding her loved ones was a passion of hers, and you could always count on Lillie for a home-cooked meal. Also known for her delectable pound cakes and banana pudding, she was affectionately referred to as “Mother Hatcher.”

Whether at home or leaving the house, Lillie took pride in dressing to impress. It was rare to see her in church without one of her signature hats and her jewelry.

Lillie had a treasured tradition of reading the Bible every night, a habit she shared with her late sister, Peggy Sue, for many years. We can all quote her favorite Bible verse, John 3:16:

“For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life.”

On Sunday, June 21, 2026, celebrating her 100th birthday and surrounded by family, she was called home to glory to be with the Lord. Lillie, was the last living sibling among her eleven brothers and sisters, embarked on her journey to eternal life after the passing of her parents, husband, and eldest son.

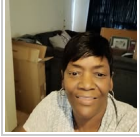
