Paul S. Fells was born October 10, 1932, in Shrewsbury, Pennsylvania. He was the last surviving son of the late Truman I Fells Sr. and the late Edna C. Nolden-Fells.

‘Smiley,’ as he was known by many, graduated from New Freedom High School, Class of 1951; and, thereafter, enlisted in the United States Army “proudly serving his country.” After thirty-two years of dedicated service, he retired from Caterpillar, Inc. As a confession of his faith, he was a former member of Fawn Grove A.M.E. Zion Church, New Park, PA, and currently a member of Bethel A.M.E. Church, York, PA. His pastimes included NASCAR races, football games, western movies, riding his Harley Davidson Motorcycle with the former “Wheels of Peace Motorcycle Club,” and spending time with his family.
