



Mr. Rayon Armeen Braxton

August 21, 1990 - November 27, 2015

Rayon, son of Armeen Braxton and Dereasha A. Banks Leaks, was born August 21, 1990 in Harrisburg, PA.

Rayon graduated from Susquehanna Township High School, Class of 2010. He was united in Christian fellowship with Faith Temple where he served with the Music Ministry.

Beginning in 2004, Rayon embraced the practice of Family Group Conference which Dauphin County adopted to bring families together to make positive decisions and solutions to varied and numerous problems. From 2006 through 2010, Rayon traveled with county commissioners, judges and administrators to teach other county officials the positive practice of decision-making.

In 2010 through 2012, Rayon taught, coordinated and directed youth in dance and play acting. He wrote the Play, "A Child Called Hope," for the purpose of bringing attention to child abuse issues. With his talented, creative and entrepreneurial abilities, Rayon continued to make an impact on the youth of the community. In 2010, with a vision and mission to create a safe haven for youth to express themselves in positive ways through dance and other art forms, he founded and established Braxton Hall. Additionally, he utilized Braxton Hall to take in troubled youth, mentor and offer them a safe place to stay if they were homeless or unable to go home.

In Harrisburg, at twenty-five years of age, on November 27, 2015, Rayon transitioned into eternal life. He leaves to share the grief and pain of his passing: his son, Kaiden M. Braxton; mother, Dereasha A. Leaks; stepfathers,

Kevin Leaks and Norwood Jones; father, Armeen Braxton; sisters, Armeasha Braxton, Saliyma Chapman, Angel Jones, Zebra Curry and Kaniah Leaks, all of Harrisburg; three brothers, Armeen Jr., Kareem and Charles Braxton, all of NY; grandmothers, Claudette Jackson of Harrisburg, and Theresa Braxton of NY; great grandmother, Miriam Jones of Harrisburg, mother of his son, Brianna Sports of Harrisburg; aunts, Kamika Banks and Markisha Peace, both of Harrisburg, and Shareem Braxton of NY; nephew, Adrian Ervin; niece, Melanie Curry; cousins, Ronnell, Najee and QuaShawn Banks, ShaNiah and Atheona Cuthbertson, all of Harrisburg; as well as other relatives and friends.

“ A young man set out to save his peers from death-by-street; however, his vision was met with much opposition. Crime, tradition, lack of support -- they all combined to try to discourage him. The more people told him change was impossible, the harder he fought to prove them wrong. Finally, someone offered him financial support; someone else, a building, others much needed encouragement. He put in the hours, (scrubbing floors, painting walls, pounding nails), to make it happen. All forms of communication were fair game to get the word out: printed flyers, which showed up on every building and post; social media, where invites and save the date notices showed up on all his “friend” walls; and word of mouth – no conversation ended without him mentioning his newest venture. Opening night was a success; the street crews came, and promised to return. Community leaders heard about a new, emerging leader, and accepted his invitation to join a forum to discuss a change. What he stated as his goal became reality; a community center/business driven not by a financial gain as much as by the desire to impact lives. The young man described himself as not afraid to be “available to the lost, misguided, and disenfranchised” – not a stranger to poverty and adversity – but equipped with first-hand knowledge on how to build a dream. Many took him at his word; they went to him for a chance and were not disappointed. The beautiful vision-caster sought to save his peers from death-by-street; nonetheless, on Friday night the street walked up two flights of stairs, into his world, and with cold-hearted deliberation, dispatched several bullets that killed his dream – and him.
