Robert J. Thompson, son of the late Lloyd Payne Thompson and Lucretia Ewing-Thompson, was born on Tuesday, October 13, 1931, in Darby, Pennsylvania.

Robert was a graduate of Darby High School, where he excelled in football, basketball, and track. After graduation, he attended Lincoln University, where he proudly played football for the Lincoln Lions. He later served honorably in the United States Army Medical Corps during the Korean War. After completing his military service, Robert built a long and dedicated career with Bethlehem Steel in Steelton, Pennsylvania, from which he retired.

On August 29, 1958, in Stroudsburg, Pennsylvania, Robert married his beloved wife, Albertine Juanita “Tina” Livingston Thompson. Together, they shared sixty-seven years of marriage rooted in love, partnership, faith, and family.

Throughout his lifetime, Robert was known for his many passions, including carving, painting, playing music, supporting civil rights efforts, and enjoying sports. He was affectionately known as “Uncle Bob” to neighborhood children and was remembered as a man always willing to lend a helping hand.

On Saturday, January 24, 2026, at the age of ninety-four, Robert peacefully transitioned into eternal rest. In addition to his parents, he was preceded in

death by his stepmother, Georgiana Thompson, and his siblings, Betty, Jean, Pete, and John (“Jack”).
