Ted graduated from William Penn High School of Harrisburg in 1955. On October 11th, 1956 Ted enlisted in the United States Marine Corps. This ignited a love with the Corps that lasted for the rest of his life. Ted earned the rank of Corporal E-3 and was awarded the Good Conduct Medal. Ted was an excellent sportsman who loved to hunt and fish. Many a summer day was spent fishing with his cousin Primo Evans and their sons. In his senior years, Ted loved doting on his grandchildren. "The Gentle Giant", as his youngest Granddaughter called him, loved to bake them cookies. Their favorite was his chocolate chip. I'll never forget the look of love and pride on his face when I came home from bootcamp.

He was also a huge music lover with a music collection that would make a collector's mouth water. His musical taste were all over the place, and it made such a huge impact on us as kids. He also loved great stereo sound and loved listening to his music LOUD. I caught that loud music bug from him. Lol

I have so many more fun and wonderful memories of my Uncle Ted, but these are just some that I will hold dear to my heart forever. I loved him so much and will miss him dearly.
