Wilhelmina May Culpepper was born Tuesday, September 2, 1924, in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, to the late James and Mildred (Jefferson) Barbee.

"Will" or "Willi," as she was called, was the second of six children. She was a graduate of the former William Penn High School and completed her course studies at the Central Pennsylvania Business School formerly on Market Street, Harrisburg, PA. Wilhelmina worked a short time for Henryton State Hospital in Henryton, Maryland, Pennsylvania Department of Highways, Harrisburg, PA, and landed her feet with the U. S. Air Force, Olmsted AFB, Middletown, PA, as an aircraft helper and aircraft mechanic as well as a variety of other assignments. Once that position phased out, she worked for the New Cumberland Army Depot doing computer programming where she became the first Black woman supervisor and from where she then retired.

Wilhelmina was a member of Camp Curtin Memorial-Mitchell United Methodist Church where she served as Sunday School Superintendent, Teacher and participated in the choir and volunteered in the soup kitchen.

In her younger years, she enjoyed bowling, reading, cooking, playing the piano and having gatherings with family and friends. She mostly cherished her Saturday visits with her baby brother Gilbert "Go" and surrounding herself with her plants. Although she loved the presence of her family, she really enjoyed her quiet time which gave her the opportunity to watch her favorite shows.

In Harrisburg, PA, on Sunday, May 1, 2016, at the blessed age of ninety-one, Wilhelmina exchanged mortality for immortality transitioning from the labors of this life into her reward of eternal life. In addition to her parents, she was preceded into eternal life by her son, Thomas F. Culpepper, whom she loved dearly; her brother, James T. Barbee Jr.; her two beloved sisters, Patricia Glasper and Jacqueline Crummel; and her first-born granddaughter, Theresa Y. Reid-Christian.

Wilhelmina leaves to celebrate her life two brothers, Eugene Barbee of New Jersey, Gilbert Barbee (Williemae) of Harrisburg, PA; her granddaughters, Kelly M.
